

Requisitioned documents

The documents required for enrollment at Intercontinental University Juneteenth include:

1. Completed application form
2. High school transcripts or equivalent
3. Standardized test scores (SAT, ACT or equivalent) - Optional
4. A Letter of Recommendation (Optional)
5. Personal Statement or Motivational Essay

Motivational Essay Questions:

1. Describe your academic and professional goals in your chosen field of study. How do you plan to use your degree to make a meaningful impact in your field?
2. Discuss your participation in community services or extracurricular activities. How do you plan to apply the skills and knowledge gained from your degree to make a positive contribution to your community?
3. Reflect on a personal or professional experience that shaped your aspirations and influenced your decision to pursue that particular degree. How did this experience inspire you to make a difference?
4. Juneteenth Intercontinental University values diversity and inclusion. How do you plan to promote these values in your field and community? How will you use your degree to advocate for social justice and equality?
5. Share any additional information or experience that you think will support your application and demonstrate your commitment to your field and community.

(1) You may submit one or more unofficial transcripts while waiting for the official transcript(s), which you must order from your former school(s) and which will be sent to our University Admissions Office in registrar@uij.ca. (2) While we accept standardized test scores (SAT, ACT, or equivalent) to further assess your academic abilities; This, however, is optional. (3) If you have not studied in English or French and your first language is not either, you must submit the results of the TEF (Test d'évaluation du français), the DELF (Diplôme d'études en langue française) or the TOEFL tests (Test of English as a Foreign Language) or IELTS (International English Language Testing System), or Cambridge English Qualifications. You can also enroll in our English as a Second Language or French (francization) courses to continue your university studies in English or French. (4) If the required documents are not in English or French, you must submit a notarized translation into English or French with your official documents.
